
◆ Featured Collection & Donor Wall

The arched opening containing books and magazines highlighting inspiring achievements and stories by and about women frames the donor wall to create a special, reflective space. The gallery space beyond further elevates the experience within the library setting.



Quiet Study ▶

Quiet study area is achieved by low bookcases and furniture arrangements that provide individual comfort and aid in concentration.





▲ Multi-Purpose Pitch and Collaboration Space

This central, dual function area provides an important conferencing area that is easily converted back into collaboration space using movable furniture.



▲ Main Entry

The protruding gallery, donor and collections forms the main library entrance and focuses the view toward the main collaboration area beyond.
